## COAT FOR GIRLS

MPORTANT NOTE: Unless yarn specified is used, African Expressions cannot accept the responsibility for the finished work.

Owing to printing restrictions the colour reproduction is matched as closely to the yarn as possible.
Original garments worked in size 11-12 years and shown on size 11 year old model. Pattern and Design by Marelie Hurter

MATERIALS: ADORE (100g balls)
5(6;7;8;9) balls, Col. 8297; 3 toggles
One pair each 6 mm and 7 mm knitting needles.
One cable needle.
One 6 mm crochet hook

## MEASUREMENTS

To fit ages: 5-6(7-8;9-10;11-12;13-14) years
Actual all round measurement of garment: Chest: 76(83;88;93;100)cm
Length to shoulder: $55(63 ; 68 ; 74 ; 80) \mathrm{cm}$
Sleeve seam: 32(34;35;40;43)cm
THE INSTRUCTIONS ARE GIVEN FOR THE SMALLEST SIZE, WITH THE LARGER SIZES N BRACKETS; WHERE ONLY ONE FIGURE IS GIVEN, IT APPLIES TO ALL SIZES.

TENSION: SAVE TIME, TAKE TIME, CHECKTENSION. 14 sts and 17 rows $=10 \mathrm{~cm}$ over Stocking Stitch using 7 mm needles FOR BEST RESULTS IT IS ESSENTIAL TO OBTAIN THE CORRECT TENSION.
FTHERE ARE TOO FEW STS ON TEST SWATCH USE THINNER NEEDLES;
F THERE ARE TOO MANY STS, USE THICKER NEEDLES.

## STITCHES USED:

MOSS STITCH PATTERN (Multiple of 2sts +1)
1st row: K1, *p1, k1, rep from * to end Rep this row.

STOCKING STITCH
1st row: RSF, one row K .
2nd row: WSF, one row $P$
Rep these 2 rows.
4-ST CABLE (Worked over 4sts)
1st row: RSF, k.
2nd row: $P$
3rd row: $K$.
4th row: P .
5th row: C4B.
6th row: $P$
Rep these 6 rows
9-ST CABLE (Worked over 9sts)
1st row: RSF, p1, T3B, p1, T3F, p1
2nd row: K1, p2, k3, p2, k1
3rd row: T3B, p3, T3F
4th row: P2, k5, p2.

5th row: K2, p2, MB (SEE UNDER ABBREVIATIONS), p2, k2 6th row: P2, k5, p2.
7th row: T3F, p3, T3B
8th row: $\mathrm{K} 1, \mathrm{p} 2, \mathrm{k} 3, \mathrm{p} 2, \mathrm{k} 1$
9th row: P1, T3F, p1, T3B, p1.
10th row: $\mathrm{K} 2, \mathrm{p} 5$, k2.
11th row: P2, T5BP, p2
12th row: K2, p5, k2
Rep these 12 rows.

## BACK:

Using 6 mm needles cast on $55(59 ; 63 ; 67 ; 71)$ sts and work in $m$ st patt (SEE STS USED) for $4(4 ; 4 ; 5 ; 5) \mathrm{cm}$ ending with a WSR. Change to 7 mm needles and cont straight in st st and when work measures $40(46 ; 50 ; 54 ; 59)$ cm from beg ending with a WSR, SHAPE ARMHOLES: Cast off $2(2 ; 3 ; 3 ; 3)$ sts at beg of next 2 rows, 2 sts at beg of foll $4(4 ; 4 ; 4 ; 6)$ rows, then dec 1 st (= work 2 tog ) at each end of foll alt row once $=41(45 ; 47 ; 51 ; 51)$ sts. Cont straight and when work measures 55(63;68;74;80)cm from beg ending with a WSR, SHAPE SHOULDERS: Cast off $3(4 ; 4 ; 5 ; 5)$ sts at beg of next 4 rows, then 4 sts at beg of foll 2 rows $=21(21 ; 23 ; 23 ; 23)$ sts. Cast off rem sts for neck opening

## RIGHT FRONT:

Using 6 mm needles cast on $27(29 ; 31 ; 33 ; 35)$ sts and work in m st patt (SEE STS USED) for $4(4 ; 4 ; 5 ; 5) \mathrm{cm}$ ending with a RSR. Next row, inc row: Work one row on WS, inc 8sts evenly across row $=35(37 ; 39 ; 41 ; 43)$ sts. Change to 7 mm needles and work in patt as folls: K2(2;4;4;6)sts, p2, work 1st row of 4 -st cable patt (SEE STS USED), p2, k2, p2, work 1st row of 9 -st cable patt (SEE STS USED), p2, k10(12;12;14;14)sts. Next row: P10(12;12;14;14)sts, k2, work 2nd row of 9-st cable patt, k2, p2, k2, work 2nd row of 4 -st cable patt, k2, p2(2;4;4;6)sts. Cont straight in patt as now set and when work measures $40(46 ; 50 ; 54 ; 59) \mathrm{cm}$ from beg ending with a RSR, SHAPE ARMHOLE: Cast off $2(2 ; 3 ; 3 ; 3)$ sts at beg of next row, 2sts at same edge of every foll alt row $2(2 ; 2 ; 2 ; 3)$ times, dec 1 st (= work 2 tog ) at beg of foll alt row $=28(30 ; 31 ; 33 ; 33)$ sts. Cont straight in patt as before and when work measures $50(58 ; 63 ; 68 ; 74) \mathrm{cm}$ from beg ending with a WSR, SHAPE NECK: Cast off $4(4 ; 5 ; 5 ; 5)$ sts at beg (neck edge) of next row, 2sts at same edge of foll alt row $2(2 ; 3 ; 3 ; 3)$ times,
then dec 1 st (= work 2tog) at beg of foll alt row 2(2;1;1;1) times = 18(20;19;21;21) sts. Cont straight and when work measures 55(63;68;74;80)cm from beg ending with a RSR, SHAPE SHOULDER: Cast off $6(7 ; 6 ; 7 ; 7)$ sts at beg of next and at same edge of foll alt row $=6(6 ; 7 ; 7 ; 7)$ sts. Work one row, then cast off rem sts to complete shoulder slope.

## LEFT FRONT:

Using 6 mm needles cast on $27(29 ; 31 ; 33 ; 35)$ sts and work in m st (SEE STS USED) for $4(4 ; 4 ; 5 ; 5) \mathrm{cm}$ ending with a RSR. Next row, inc row: Work one row on WS, inc 8sts evenly across row $=35(37 ; 39 ; 41 ; 43)$ sts Change to 7 mm needles and work in patt as folls: K10(12;12;14;14)sts, p2, work 1st row of 9 -st cable patt, p2, k2, p2, work 1st row of 4 -st cable patt, p2, k2 $(2 ; 4 ; 4 ; 6)$ sts. Next ow: P2(2;4;4;6)sts, k2, work 2nd row of 4 -s cable patt, k2, p2, k2, work 2 nd row of 9 -st cable patt, k2, p10(12;12;14;14)sts. Cont straight in patt as now set and work as for right front, rev shapings.

## SLEEVES (Both Alike):

Using 6 mm needles cast on $29(31 ; 33 ; 35 ; 35)$ sts and work in m st patt for $4(4 ; 4 ; 5 ; 5) \mathrm{cm}$ ending with a WSR. Change to 7 mm needles and cont in st st, inc 1 st at each end o every foll 10(8;8;6;6)th row 3(2;6;5;6) times hen every foll $12(10 ; 0 ; 8 ; 8)$ th row $1(3 ; 0 ; 3 ; 3)$ times $=37(41 ; 45 ; 51 ; 53)$ sts. Cont straight and when work measures $32(34 ; 35 ; 40 ; 43) \mathrm{cm}$ from beg ending with a WSR, SHAPE TOP OF SLEEVE: Cast off $2(2 ; 3 ; 3 ; 3)$ sts at beg of next 2 rows, then cast off 2sts at beg of foll 10(12;14;12;14) rows, then $3(1 ; 1 ; 3 ; 5)$ sts at beg of foll $2(4 ; 2 ; 4 ; 2)$ rows $=7(9 ; 9 ; 9 ; 9)$ sts Cast off rem sts.

## TO MAKE UP:

Sew shoulder seams. COLLAR: RSF, using 6mm needles, pick up and k17(17;19;20;20) sts around neck edge of right front 23(23;25;25;25)sts across back neck and 17(17;19;20;20)sts down neck edge of left front $=57(57 ; 63 ; 65 ; 65)$ sts. Work in m st patt for $8(8 ; 9 ; 10 ; 11) \mathrm{cm}$ ending with a WSR, cast off all sts in patt. FRONT BANDS: Using 6 mm needles, pick up and k71(81;87;95;103)sts evenly along right front edge and work in m st patt for $3(3 ; 3 ; 4 ; 4) \mathrm{cm}$ ending with a WSR. Cast of all sts in patt Work the same for the other band. Set in sleeves. Sew up side and sleeve seams

LOOPS FOR TOGGLES (Make 6): Using 6 mm crochet hook, leave 10 cm of yarn for the fastening to be attached to coat, work a length of chain sts $8-10 \mathrm{~cm}$ long (or desired ength) and fasten off, leaving 10 cm of yarn at this end as well. Thread 3 of the strips through holes in toggles and pin them to ight front, placing the top one 1 cm below neck edge and next to front band edge, then the others in position spaces 10-12cm apart To attach the strips, pass the ends of yarn between 2 sts and the other end one row ower; knot the ends on WS and sew them into place. Block garment to measurement cover with a damp cloth and allow to dry.


## Garment Care

This is important for ensuring that your labour of love remains in pristine condition. Always hand wash garments in a mild soapy solution. Allow to dry flat (on a bath towel on the floor). Never hang your garment on the washing line to dry and always fold and store in a drawer or flat on a shelf.
