



STRIPED BEANIE

IMPORTANT NOTE: Unless yarn specified is used, African Expressions cannot accept the responsibility for the finished work.

Owing to printing restrictions the colour reproduction is matched as closely to the yarn as possible.

Original garment worked in one size only and shown on an average size model.

Pattern and Design by Roxanne Maddocks.

MATERIALS: JOY (50g balls)

1 ball each Charcoal 1062 A, Navy Blue 1095 B and Light Grey 1057 C.

One pair 4mm knitting needles.

One sewing needle.

MEASUREMENTS:

To fit average adult head size.
THE INSTRUCTIONS ARE GIVEN FOR ONE SIZE ONLY.

TENSION: SAVE TIME, TAKE TIME, CHECK TENSION.

22sts and 30 rows = 10cm over Stocking Stitch using 4mm needles.

FOR BEST RESULTS IT IS ESSENTIAL TO OBTAIN THE CORRECT TENSION.

IF THERE ARE TOO FEW STS ON TEST SWATCH, USE THINNER NEEDLES;

IF THERE ARE TOO MANY STS, USE THICKER NEEDLES.

ABBREVIATIONS:

beg = begin(ning); cont = continue; dec = decrease;
foll = follow(ing); k = knit; patt(s) = pattern(s);
p = purl; rep = repeat; R(W)SF = right(wrong) side
facing; R(W)SR = right(wrong) side row; st(s) =
stitch(es); st st = stocking stitch; tog = together

STITCHES USED:

SINGLE RIB PATTERN:

1st row: K1, *p1, k1, rep from * to the end. **2nd row:** P1, *k1, p1 rep from * to the end.

Rep these 2 rows. STOCKING STITCH: 1st row: RSF, one row K. 2nd row: WSF, one row P.

Rep these 2 rows.

STRIPED BEANIE

Using 4mm needles and A, cast on 120sts and work in single rib patt for 14 rows. Now work in st st and stripes as folls: 2 rows A, 4 rows B, 2 rows A. 4 rows C. 2 rows A. 2 rows B. 2 rows A. 2 rows C, 2 rows A, 2 rows B, 2 rows A, 2 rows C, then 2 rows A. **Next row, dec row:** Using B, *(k5, k2tog) rep from * to the end, k1. Next row: P. Next row. dec row: Using A, *(k4, k2tog) rep from * to the end, k1. Next row: P. Next row, dec row: Using C, *(k3, k2tog) rep from * to the end, k1. **Next row:** P. Next row, dec row: Using A, *(k2, k2tog) rep from * to the end, k1. Next row: P. Next row, dec row: Using B, *(k1, k2tog) rep from * to the end, k1. Next row: P. Next row, dec row: Using A, *k2tog rep from * 17 times, k1. Next row: P. Next row, **dec row:** Using C, *K2tog rep from * 9 times = 9sts. Next row: P.

TO MAKE UP:

Break the yarn keeping it long enough to sew up the seam of the beanie. Thread the yarn tail through the darning needle and slip the 9sts off the knitting needle onto the darning needle. Pull the yarn tightly through the 9sts. This step pulls the beanie together and actually looks more like a beanie. Pin the seam with the right side facing each other and sew the seam. Sew in any loose threads.
